UNIFORM POLICY**

OUR EXPECTATIONS

It is school policy that the correct uniform is worn daily and that students be neat and tidy in their appearance including; clothing, shoes, jewellery and hair. Our uniform standards are compulsory, when completing your enrolment acceptance, you are agreeing to these expectations. [CEDB Policy](#)

SUMMER UNIFORM

GIRLS - Pink gingham dress (pink & white check), white socks, maroon v-neck woollen or cotton jumper (no sloppy joes), black polishable school shoes (no joggers or sports shoes), blue school bucket hat purchased from the school office and school badge. Year 6 students are able to wear school issued year 6 jumper / jersey.

BOYS - Grey school shorts, blue short sleeved button up shirt, grey socks, grey v-neck woollen or cotton jumper (no sloppy joes) black polishable school shoes (no joggers or sports shoes), blue school bucket hat purchased from the school office and school badge. Year 6 students are able to wear school issued year 6 jumper / jersey.

WINTER UNIFORM

GIRLS - Maroon tunic or slacks, fawn long-sleeved button up blouse, maroon v-neck woollen or cotton jumper (no sloppy joes) fawn socks / stockings, black polishable school shoes (no joggers or sports shoes), blue school bucket hat purchased from the school office, maroon / parka jacket and school badge. Year 6 students are able to wear school issued year 6 jumper / jersey.

BOYS - Grey school pants, blue long sleeved button up shirt, grey socks, grey v-neck woollen or cotton jumper (no sloppy joes) black polishable school shoes (no joggers or sports shoes), blue school bucket hat to be purchased from school office, royal blue parka / jacket and school badge. Year 6 students are able to wear school issued year 6 jumper / jersey.

SPORTS UNIFORM

Blue St Phil's shorts or skort (for girls), white polo shirt with school emblem (long or short sleeved), blue tracksuit pants with school emblem, blue sports jacket with school emblem, blue school bucket hat to be purchased from school office and school badge. School joggers

to be plain white or plain black in colour – no mixed colours / coloured laces etc). Year 6 students are able to wear school issued year 6 jumper / jersey and polo shirt.

JEWELLERY & NAILS

Jewellery is limited to a watch, and **ONE** set of sleepers or studs. Necklaces, rings, bracelets and bangles are not permitted to be worn as they pose a safety risk and children also get upset if they are lost. Fingernails are to be of natural colour, no acrylic / false nails and of a short length. Long nails are a safety hazard in the classroom and playground.

HAIR

Long hair past the collar must be tied back or plaited as it discourages head lice and children's ability to see. This is a practice encouraged by NSW Health ([click here](#)).

Hairstyles are to be appropriate for primary school aged children and **do not** include mullets, mohawks, hair art (shaved pictures or words) and hair is to be of natural colour.

CULTURAL & RELIGIOUS DRESS

Cultural headwear and tights are permissible in some circumstances and should be discussed with the principal. In the case that this is approved, headwear and tights must match the appropriate summer (white tights / headdress) and winter (headdress – maroon for girls and black for boys)

INCORRECT / MISSING UNIFORM

Children will be issued with a verbal warning for incorrect uniform, with a note on compass. If there is an additional issue, within a consecutive / short period of time, there will be a note sent home via SeeSaw and Compass from the class teacher requesting a reason and reasonable timeframe for the uniform issue to be fixed. This will also be recorded on Compass.

Should there be a third compass note recorded, parents / carers will be contacted by the Principal to assess the reason for the continued uniform issue. This meeting will be in attempt to assist the family with any possible barriers to wearing correct uniform and an understanding reached that supports the uniform policy.

Please be advised that we have a uniform pool that is operated from the school Canteen each Friday morning, facilitated by the P&F. There are a large range of good, second hand clothes at a very low price, or a swap system for larger sizes. You can also access the uniform pool at Marietta's George Street which has a larger range of clothing and sizes.
